- **Leadership & Supervision**: Recruit, train, and supervise facilitators, interns, and volunteers to ensure program excellence. Provide coaching, support, and professional development opportunities.
- Community Engagement & Partnerships: Build and strengthen relationships with schools, community organizations, and referral partners. Represent Cornerstone of Hope in public forums, cultivating partnerships that expand program reach and sustainability.
- **Grant & Reporting Support**: Collaborate with the Development Team by contributing program outcomes, data, and stories that demonstrate impact for grants, funders, and stakeholders.

- Deliver Grief Counseling and Support: Provide individual and group counseling to students

- **Conduct In-School Support Groups**: Implement the In-School Grief Support Programs, facilitating group sessions for elementary, middle, and high school students as needed. Tailor activities and discussions to address the unique needs of each age group.
